<p>Paint a piece of paper using rainbow colours or stick strips of coloured card to paper so it looks like a rainbow. Once dried place in a tin or box. Add flour, rice or sand and make patterns. Can you write your name? Can you write words that rhyme with hop, cap, mat, sun?</p> 	<p>Create a handprint sun catcher. Add pieces of tissue paper to paper. Fold the paper in half and draw around your hand. Place the hand so the thumb and index finger are along the folded part of the paper. This will create the 'heart' look. Cut out your hand template and unfold to show your handprint sun catcher.</p> 	<p>Create a face on a tree using mud and natural materials found in your garden/collected whilst on a walk, or, create a face on the ground using natural materials.</p> 	<p>Explore colouring mixing using hand prints. Paint one hand a primary colour and the other hand another primary colour and print on the paper. Then paint again and then rub them together. Print the final colour onto the paper.</p> 	<p>Create a hand print tree. Draw around your hand and arm and then paint it. Add 'leaves' using finger prints.</p>

<p>For this week's Friday quiz, can your child ask 1 question about a minibeast? Send them through Tapestry (with the answer please)!</p>	<p>Create your own water wall using bottles. Recycle bottles you have in the house and cut out a hole at the bottom of the bottle. Place them above each other on a wall or fence and pour water from the top one and watch it flow through.</p> 	<p>Cut out egg shapes from coloured card. Draw different segments on the egg. Write a number in each segment with pen. Cut out the segments and have fun putting them back together again. Have a go putting them back in the correct order.</p> 	<p>Create a pattern on paper. Add loose materials (e.g. buttons, sequins or any other material you have at home ) and place on top, following the patterns.
